Many of us became familiar with Lillie through her appearances on The Gaither Homecoming videos. What an incredible spirit she brought to those videos. I always looked forward to her grabbing a microphone and making the song her own.

Her list of accomplishments are many, including Dove Awards, Grand Ole Opry appearances, singing to 250,000 people in Rio De Janeiro, numerous other and achievements.
